New Kansas Immunization Requirements for the 2010-2011 School Year

From Kansas Dept. of Health

Tdap/TD: A booster dose of Tdap is required at 11 years of age if more than 2 years since previous dose of Td. For adolescents older than 11 years of age, Tdap booster required 10 years after completion of the primary series or previous dose.

Varicella (chicken pox): Two doses required for Kindergartners and 1st graders for the 2010 –2011 school year and one dose required for grades 2-10 for the 2010-2011 school year. No vaccination is required if prior varicella disease is verified by a physician. Two doses are *recommended* for all children.

Hepatitis A: Two doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs.

Asbestos Notification

During the 1988-1989 school year, by order of the Argonia Public Schools, USD 359 completed a survey of all buildings owned or leased by the USD 359 as required by 40 CFR part 763, Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule. This rule, which was enacted by Congress in 1987, requires all local education agencies to identify the location and condition of all asbestos-containing materials in the schools, and to develop plans to minimize the hazard of airborne asbestos fibers to building occupants.

Each of our facilities was inspected by accredited asbestos inspectors. The inspectors located, sampled, and rated the condition and the potential hazard of all material suspected to contain, or assumed to contain, asbestos.

The inspection reports and laboratory analysis records were turned over to an accredited asbestos management planner who developed an asbestos management plan for each of our facilities. The plans include the inspection report, hazard assessment, and procedures for controlling any hazard that may exist.

Where asbestos is in good condition, as it is in most of our schools, the asbestos has been left in place serving its intended purpose. Every six months an accredited asbestos inspector examines all asbestos-containing materials in buildings owned or leased by the USD 359 to determine its present condition, as required by the above-mentioned Federal Rule. In addition to our regular maintenance, asbestos removal activities have been completed over various sites over the past several years. The criteria for selecting the sites for asbestos abatement are need and budgetary constraints. The three biggest priority conditions that dictate asbestos removal are those where the damage to the asbestos containing material is required; where removal of the asbestos is required to make necessary repairs (such as repiping); and where replacement of equipment (such as boilers) or major building renovations cannot be accomplished until the asbestos is removed. All abatement activities are recorded in the building management plan.

The asbestos management plan of your school site is available for your inspection at no cost or restriction. Copies of the plan which are located in the administration office of each school and at the USD 359 district office can be reviewed during regular school hours. A copy of the plan will be made available upon request for a reasonable fee. Any questions concerning the plan should be directed to Dr. Dolley.

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Admission Requirements

All resident students shall be admitted to attend school in the district unless they have been expelled.

A resident student is any child who has attained the age of eligibility for school attendance and lives with a parent or a person acting as a parent who is a resident of the district. Pre-school students must be four years of age on or before August 31, unless otherwise specified on their IEP. Kindergarten students must be five years of age on or before August 31.

All students enrolling in the district for the first time shall provide required proof of identity. Students enrolling in kindergarten or first grade shall provide a certified copy of their birth certificate or other documentation, which the board determines to be satisfactory. Students enrolling in grades 2—12 shall provide a certified transcript or similar pupil records. Please provide the name and address of the student's previous school so school records can be requested.

The enrollment documentation shall include a student's permanent record card with a student's legal name, as it appears on the birth certificate, or as changed by a court order and the name, address, telephone number of the lawful custodian. The records shall also provide the identity of the student as evidenced by a birth certificate, copy of a court order placing the student in the custody of Kansas Social and Rehabilitation Services, a certified transcript of the student, a baptismal certificate or hospital record.

All new students to the district need to provide social security number. Students new to the district also need to bring immunization records, transcripts (high school students), birth certificate and Social Security card.

Immunizations

All students enrolling in any district school shall provide the building principal with proof of immunization of certain diseases or furnish documents to satisfy statutory requirements. Booster shots required by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Environment are also required.

Students who fail to provide the documentation required by law may be excluded from school by the superintendent until statutory requirements are satisfied. Notice of exclusion shall be given to the parents/guardians as prescribed by law. Students who are not immunized against a particular disease(es) may be excluded from school during any outbreak.

Health Assessments

All students up to the age of nine shall submit evidence they have undergone a health assessment prior to entering kindergarten or before enrolling in the district for the first time.

Lunch Policy Reminder

Elementary students will not be allowed to charge more than five (5) lunches or breakfasts. This policy will be strictly enforced. Classroom teachers will send reminder notices home on a weekly basis.

Secondary students will not be permitted to charge lunches. A student will be permitted only two lunches past their paid account as an alert that payment is due to the high school office. After that time it is the responsibility of the students to bring their own lunch.

If current family financial conditions permit, the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program will allow a school age student to eat a school hot lunch. Contact your child's school office for information concerning this program if you feel your child is eligible for benefits.



Attention School Bus Riders

The state law does not allow food and drink to be consumed on school buses while taking children to and from school. Bus drivers will ask your children to dispose of or consume same before getting on the bus. The reason for this regulation is the fear of a child choking on food or drink caused by the movement of the bus. Please make sure your child(ren) are aware of this.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

Students attending Argonia Public Schools who plan to participate in sports/cheerleading must have a physical by their physician or by the Argonia Clinic. **Fall practice begins August**

16th. Physicals must be completed and turned in to the student's coach or the high school office before a student may practice. Forms are available at the Argonia Clinic, the high school office, district office, and on the KSHSAA website <http://www.kshsaa.org>. The number for the Argonia Clinic is 435-6356. There are limited appointments at the clinic so you need to call ASAP to schedule an appointment.



Elementary Medication Policy

Parents of elementary students need to be reminded of the school medication policy. Only prescribed medications will be given at school by school personnel.

Any nonprescription, over-the-counter medications will need to be given by a parent or guardian. Children will not be allowed to bring medications such as cough syrup, cough drops, throat lozenges, etc. to school. Any medications prescribed by a doctor that need to be taken during school hours must be in the original container and accompanied by a Permission Medication Form, signed by both the doctor and the parent/guardian. This form must be on file in the elementary office prior to any medication being administered. A copy of the required form can be found in the elementary handbook.
