AHS BOYS CAPTURE THE 2015 BORDER QUEEN TOURNAMENT TITLE! by Coach Almanza

The Argonia Raiders captured the 2015 Border Queen Tournament for the first time in a number of years. The Raiders got their first win of the tournament against Caldwell, the team who beat Argonia in the Sub-State Championship last year. The Raiders beat the Blue Jays 42-38, getting their first win of the season. The game was close throughout, but the Raiders pulled it out. Evan Dolley led the Raiders in scoring, chipping in 19 points.

The Raiders next played Central Burden. The Raiders were pretty familiar with this SCBL team, playing them 4 times last year. The Raiders played three solid quarters building a 46-20 score at the end of the third quarter. Although the Raiders lost some of that lead in the fourth, they managed to hang on for the victory, beating Central Burden 53 to 37.

The Raiders finished out the Round Robin tournament playing Norwich. The Raiders probably played their best defense of the season, holding Norwich to 30 points for the game. Argonia was led in scoring by Seth Hemberger, who threw in 21 points. Kolten Koerner added 13 points to help secure the win.

"As coach, I was very proud of the boys' effort in the tournament", said Coach Almanza. As alluded to before, it has been a number of years since Argonia had won the title. A further congratulations goes to Seth Hemberger and Kolten Koerner, who were selected as members of the all-tournament team.

After beating Cunningham following the tournament, the Raiders are now 4-1 on the season. They will open up league play after Christmas by going to West Elk on January 8.

Two Argonia football players were recognized on the 2015 District 4 All-District Football Team. Junior Seth Hemberger earned 2nd Team Running Back and Linebacker. Senior Aaron Harsh earned Honorable Mention Offensive End and 2nd Team Defensive End.

Seth and Aaron were also recognized by the Wichita Eagle and Topeka Capital-Journal as Honorable Mention All-State Linebacker and Honorable Mention Offensive End respectively.

Seth and Aaron both had exceptional years. Seth rushed for over 400 yards and 6 touchdowns on offense and racked up 72 tackles, 2 sacks, 1 interception, and 5 fumble recoveries on defense. He also had 3 defensive touchdowns and 2 safeties.

AHS NAMED STATE FINALIST IN THE \$2 MILLION SAMSUNG SOLVE FOR TOMORROW CONTEST

School received two Samsung Galaxy® Tabs

Argonia High School announced that they had become a Kansas state finalist in the <u>Samsung Solve</u> for <u>Tomorrow</u> contest, a nationwide competition to increase interest in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) by challenging teachers and students to take topics out of traditional classroom settings and into local communities. Unfortunately, however, Argonia did not win the next level.

"We were honored to be one of the five finalists in the State and we will continue to look into developing a project that will benefit our entire community," said Superintendent Julie McPherron.

Argonia High School moved onto the round of the competition for their interest in using STEM to address the water problems in the City of Argonia. Argonia High School was one of five schools in Kansas to become a state finalist in the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow contest. During the next phase of the competition, Argonia High School Science Teacher, Mr. Neal, created a lesson plan to address the issue in an educational setting. 51 state winners were announced in December, with Jackson Heights winning the State award.

ANNUAL CUPSTACKING RETURNS AGAIN!!

In recent weeks, the K-5th graders at Argonia Elementary have been learning about cup stacking and enhancing their skills. By definition, cup stacking (also known speed stacking) is a sport that involves stacking 12 specialized cups in specific sequences in as little time as possible. Sequences are usually pyramids of three, six, or ten cups. The students learned how to stack cups in pre-determined sequences as in a 3-3-3 stack, 3-6-3 stack or a cycle stack which is a 3-6-3 stack, a 6-6 stack, and a 1-10-1 stack in that order. Cup stacking participants are shown to learn cooperation, ambidexterity, speed, concentration, and hand-eye coordination.

To end their unit, a cup stacking competition was held. Kindergarten and first grades competed against each other using a basic 3-3-3 stack. Second and third grades competed against each other using the 6-6 stack. While the fourth and fifth graders had to complete the cycle stack. Winners were determined by the fastest time without any fumbles or miscues. The Kindergarten and first grade winner was Briley Booker. The winner of the 2nd-3rd grade competition was Autumn Coleman, and the 4th-5th grade competition winner was Briley's older sister, Brenna Booker. These 3 girls are all following in their oldest sisters' footsteps and carrying on in their family's tradition during the cup stacking tournament. Each winner will receive a set of cup stacking cups and a timing mat.
