The Argonia Lady Raiders traveled to Dexter, KS on Saturday, September 16 for the Spartan Invitational. The ladies faced Ark City Christian (25-17, 25-18), Central Burden (25-21, 25-12), and Cedar-Vale Dexter (25-17, 25-14) in pool play. They dominated pool play and swept all 3 matches in 2 sets! In the Ark City Christian match, Leah Fitch

had 13 digs, Cora Vineyard added 5 digs and also had 3 kills, while Baylee Booker had 6 assists. For the Central Burden match, Cora Vineyard had a spiketacular game with 8 kills and 6 digs, Leah Fitch had an amazing 14 digs, and Baylee Booker had 13 assists with 5 digs as well. Aubreigh Haxton added 2 kills during this game and 6 digs.

The girls took 1st seed in Pool A so they played the 2nd seed in Pool B, which was Wichita Homeschool - whom the girls had defeated previously in the season. They got down to business again, striving to get to that championship game! They defeated Wichita Homeschool in 2 sets, 25-17 and 25-13. Aubreigh Haxton, Cora Vineyard, and Karrlea Hessman each had a solo block, and for digs Leah had 13, Cora had 10, Baylee had 9, and Alexis and Karrlea each had 5. Flinthills won the match on the other court and that's who the Lady Raiders faced for the championship match. This was the same set up as the tournament last year, where the ladies ended up bringing home 2nd place. They came out with a vengeance against Flinthills and totally controlled the tempo of the game, defeating the Mustangs 25-8. It was like we shocked them with what we could do! During the second game, we had a mild mental breakdown and were down 17-14. I called a timeout to try and get the girls back centered and focused and they went back out and did both of those - only allowing Flinthills to score 3 more points, beating them 25-20.

My assistant coach, Jenny, and I were talking about how we never felt like we were going to lose that match, the girls had fire in them that just was fueled by heart and drive and they pulled it out. Karrlea Hessman went up for a big swing on the outside at game point and it went straight to the floor to win! This was just so amazing because we always talk to the girls about being aggressive on game point and taking the point for ourselves, not just waiting for the opponent to mess up. This was Coach Jen and I's first 1st place as coaches and we were just ecstatic! Hard work certainly does pay off and we had a big payday on Saturday! I heard comments throughout the day that Argonia was the team to watch out for - and that was so good to hear!
