2017 SCBL TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

The Lady Raiders could not have asked for a better day of volleyball on Saturday, October 7th, at Sedan for the 2017 SCBL tournament! They went in seeded second and came out on top with 1st place and brought home the gold! They started the tournament fired up and taking names right off the bat against West Elk, South Haven, and Flinthills in pool play, and kept the momentum going during bracket play without faltering! Below are stats from our first four games of the day. West Elk (25-13, 25-13): Cora had 14 kills and 8 digs, Alexis had 6 kills and 8 digs, Hope had 10 digs, and Baylee had 7 digs, 23 assists, and 2 aces. South Haven (25-15, 25-8): Taylor Schulte had 6 aces and served a total of 20 serves in this match adding 9 digs, Alexis had 2 aces with 6 digs and 4 kills, Karrlea had 4 kills as well with 5 digs, and Cora had 7 kills with 7 digs.

Flinthills (25-23, 25-17): Cora had 13 kills 2 blocks and 5 digs, Karrlea had 17 digs and 2 kills, Alexis had 10 digs with 3 kills, Baylee had 3 kills and 20 assists, and Hope had 5 digs and 2 kills.

Cedar-Vale Dexter (25-10, 25-15): Cora led with 12 kills and 5 digs, Karrlea had 14 digs, Alexis had 11 digs with 4 kills, Hope had 3 kills and 4 digs, Baylee and Taylor added 5 digs. The girls faced Udall in the championship match. Udall has given us three of our losses this season, and we have come so close to beating them twice. When we lost the third time to Udall, I told the girls that night we would meet them for the final time in the championship game at the league tournament and that was going to be our last time seeing them this season. I told them that is when we are going to beat them and we prepared in practice to do just that! During a timeout in the first game, I applauded the girls on how SMART they were playing! They were listening to their coaches and being such coachable athletes! Our defense made all the difference this final match up with them - Every player had double digits in digs: Taylor Schulte - 15, Karrlea Hessman - 10, Cora Vineyard - 14, Alexis Vineyard - 12, Hope Casner - 12, and Baylee Booker - 11. We also hit the ball really well against them, having very few errors and more kills - Cora led with 11 kills and 4 blocks, Alexis with 5 kills, Karrlea with 3, and Hope with 2. Baylee Booker had 25 setting assists as well as 2 blocks. Another factor in this game that made a huge impact was our serve receive - only two errors total, which is our best match as far as serve receive stats go. Winning this game not only won us the league tournament championship, but also gave Udall their first loss and that is something the girls have been talking about doing all season. We have had some injuries lately that have drastically changed our starting lineup and rotation. Underclassmen, Karrlea Hessman and Taylor Schulte, stepped up to fill some big spots on Saturday that really made a difference! They did an amazing job and the other girls on the floor did an awesome job helping them adjust. We had great leadership from our captains, Cora Vineyard and Baylee Booker, who stepped up to the challenge of getting everyone in sync on the court. We also had to change our defensive setup and I am so proud of the way the girls handled these adjustments and helped each other all day. They were communicating and picking each other up - really looking like a team and playing together as one.

Our record is now 25-5, which as the girls say, "rolls off the tongue quite nicely". We've still got 2 more Tuesday nights of play that we are going to stay focused on to improve our record as well as start preparing for substate play. Our goal is to stay focused and determined on our game and what we can do to get even better and ready for post-season play.


