
















Fifth grade went to the Cosmosphere for our field trip! We enjoyed a planetarium show, Dr. Goddard's laboratory and the museum! We love space!



The screening will include various areas of development including communication, gross & fine motor skills, problem solving, and social skills.

On Monday, August 12th, 2024, from 8:30 a.m. - 10:00 a.m, Sumner County Educational Services and Parents As Teachers will offer a free developmental screening to children, ages birth through 5. If you are interested in how your child is growing and developing, please call the elementary school office at 620-435-6311 x1 to schedule an appointment. Over the summer the office will be closed. Parents of children ages birth to 2.5, you will meet one on one with a provider, and will be asked about how your child is developing. If your child is currently enrolled in Argonia's preschool, or is on an IFSP/IEP, it is not necessary to have him/her screened. If you have any questions or concerns, please talk with your child's teacher.
